

A Few Operational Strategies of My Enemy

It is the operation of the Enemy to persistently plunge me into the depths of doubt, accusation, guilt and impossibility (Genesis 3; Matthew 4; Revelation 12:10)

The Enemy knows my vulnerabilities and weak-spots making it all the more important that I seek my only refuge and strength in the Lord every day and all day
(Psalm 25:16-21)

It is the operation of the Enemy to push me outside of engagement within the Body of Christ...

- Because of a false sense of being damaged goods
- Because of an offense that "you do not take captive"
- Because of a false idea that you are not essential to the Body

It is the operation of the Enemy to cast doubt on my justification and approval in Christ because of a false idea of "freedom"

Freedom is falsely defined as the absence of struggle; in actuality freedom is not so much the absence of struggle as it is the belief that the struggle is not in vain

It is the operation of the Enemy to move me as quickly as he can through the school of waiting in order to set me up for even greater frustration

Groups that need to wait but often don't:

1. The recently redeemed
2. The recently revived
3. The recently repentant
4. The recently restored

It is the operation of the Enemy to convince me that God's promises and blessings are no longer for me...but this is just not true (2 Samuel 22 and 1 Chronicles 20:1-3; John 4, 8; Luke 7)
